# About the Congress

The Asian and Oceanian Section of the Movement Disorders Society (MDS-AOS) was formed in June 2005. This Section is similar to the established European Section of the MDS and seeks to bring together doctors, researchers, and healthcare professionals involved in treating Parkinson's disease and movement disorders throughout Asia and Oceania. The Asian and Oceanian Section (AOS) of the MDS was officially inaugurated at the 10th International Congress of the Movement Disorders Society in Kyoto, Japan, in October 2006.

The Asian and Oceanian Parkinson's Disease and Movement Disorders Congress (AOPMC) is the inaugural Congress of the Asian and Oceanian Section of the MDS and it is hoped that such a meeting will be held once every 2 years in the region. The host organizer for this meeting is the National Neuroscience Institute, Singapore. The Congress will demonstrate the objectives of the MDS-AOS which include:

- Facilitating communication between clinicians and researchers in the region.
- Disseminating up-to-date knowledge about Movement Disorders.
- Improving quality of life and independence of Movement Disorders patients and carers.
- Promoting research and facilitating research collaborations in Movement Disorders within the region.
- Exposing clinicians, researchers, and healthcare professionals in the region to Movement Disorders initiatives and encourage their membership in the MDS-AOS.

This meeting will provide an opportunity for participants to learn about the latest research and perspectives, to listen to world-renowned speakers, and to be exposed to the most-up-to-date information in the field of Parkinson's disease and Movement Disorders. All sessions at the Congress will be conducted in English.

The 1<sup>st</sup> AOPMC is being held concurrently at the same venue as the 6<sup>th</sup> International Symposium of the Asian and Pacific Parkinsons Association (APPA) which is specially for patients, caregivers, nurses, therapists and allied health professionals. # Call for Abstracts

CLOSING DATE: **15 JULY 2007**

## 1. GENERAL INFORMATION

- a) Participants are invited to submit abstracts for **Poster and Video Presentations**.
- b) **Video** presentations may be submitted for patients with movement disorders who have interesting diagnostic features or management challenges. These presentations should not exceed 5 minutes each and will be followed by a discussion led by the Chairs of the Video Presentations Session.
- c) All abstracts for poster and video presentations must be submitted online. Online submission will be available from 1 May 2007. Abstracts submission via mail or fax will not be accepted.
- d) Abstracts must be submitted according to the instructions below and must be received by **15 JULY 2007**. No abstract will be considered after the closing deadline. For video presentations, a copy of the video presentation on a compact disc (CD) must be mailed to the Secretariat with the presenters name and title of the presentation clearly marked on it by **15 July 2007**.
- e) All abstracts must indicate the Presentation Category, which the abstracts belong to.
- f) All Presenting Authors, whose abstracts are accepted, **MUST** be paid registrants no later than 1 September 2007.
- g) More details are available on the Congress website.

## 2. SUBMISSION INSTRUCTIONS

- a) Abstracts must be typed in English on the Online Abstract Submission Form.
- b) Title: Use a concise title, that reflects abstract content.

- c) Abstracts: All abstracts must be typed in Courier font size 10 with single spacing, and must fit within the box of the Online Abstract Form.
- d) Text length (not including title and author information) must be at least 100 words and not exceed 250 words.
- e) For poster presentations, the purpose of the study, methodology, results and conclusion should be clearly stated.
- f) For video presentations, the abstract should provide a concise account of the case being presented including key features in the history, examination, investigations, diagnosis, and management.

## 3. REVIEW, ACCEPTANCE & NOTIFICATION

- a) Receipt of abstract submission will be acknowledged via email.
- b) The AOPMC Scientific Committee will review all abstract submissions. Evaluation by the Committee will be based on quality, clarity and relevance for our audience, as well as the significance of the material.
- c) Presenting authors will receive notification via email of abstracts' acceptance/rejection in late July 2007.
- d) Presenting authors will be informed via email the details of presentation (including date and time) in September 2007.
- e) Submission of abstracts therefore constitutes the authors' consent to have the abstracts published in the AOPMC Abstracts Book. Abstracts may also be edited for publication.

## 4. POSTER PRESENTATION

- a) Exact poster specifications and sessions will be included in the notification of acceptance.

- b) Poster presenters are requested to stand-by their posters during the poster sessions and also to take note of the poster set-up and take-down schedules.
- c) Please note that the AOPMC Organisers will not be liable for any damage or loss to the posters.
- d) Authors should acknowledge any conflicts of interest/source of funding in the oral or poster presentations.

## 5. ORAL PLATFORM PRESENTATION BY INVITATION

- a) **Oral Platform Presentation by Invitation:** The Scientific Review Committee will invite authors of selected paper to make an oral presentation at the Scientific Presentation session.
- b) Awards will be presented to the best research papers.
- c) Information on oral presentation will be communicated to authors of selected paper.

## 6. VIDEO PRESENTATION

- a) Presenters will be given 5 minutes for the case presentation (history, examination and basic investigations) accompanied with a video.
- b) The Chairs of the session will then discuss the case and audience will then be invited to participate in the discussion or to ask questions.
- c) The presenter should then proceed to present the results of definitive diagnostic investigations and provide the final diagnosis. It is not necessary to follow-up with a detailed presentation on the topic or disease. Each presentation including discussion should not last more than 10 minutes.
